As I reflect on the past year, I'm in awe at the displays of resilience by our local communities and dedicated teams in the face of many challenges. Community is at the heart of everything we do, and care guides all our actions. I am immensely proud to share stories from our community support efforts in 2023 through the Western Communities Foundation, the charitable arm of Western Financial Group. Despite the numerous challenges we faced with the onslaught of catastrophic events and natural disasters across the country, our community came together in remarkable displays of resilience and strength, giving back over \$600,000 to the communities where we live and work.

In response to the wildfires and flooding across Canada, our collective efforts with local community partners demonstrated unwavering commitments to being there when our communities needed us the most. From ensuring our colleagues in affected areas were safe and accounted for to caring for our customers, the Western Communities Foundation donated \$25,000 to the Red Cross British Columbia Wildfires Appeal and the Nova Scotia and Atlantic Canada Appeal through our Emergency Support Fund. Together with local community members, our collective spirit and determination have shown us that even in the face of adversity, we can strengthen the communities where we live and work.

In the past year, we've supported 135 exceptional students, including 19 Indigenous students, through our Inspirational Bursary Award program. These awards empower our students to pursue their post-secondary goals, overcoming personal challenges along the way.

The Western Communities Foundation, our team members, and our business partners have been key in positively impacting local communities for 23 years. By actively raising funds for causes that are important to our people, and customers, we have collectively raised \$200,000 to fund 40 Infrastructure Grants. These grants support community enhancement projects that promote resilience, social belonging, safety, and sustainability. Five of these grants were awarded to Indigenous communities, honouring and preserving their rich cultural heritage and resilience. As we enter another year of service, we are reminded that our work is not done in isolation but in partnership with each of you. To our donors, community partners, and team members—thank you for your support. Your involvement sparks positive change in our communities. With your help, the Communities Foundation celebrates 23 years of empowering change in our

communities from coast to coast.

Supporting Communities Through Disaster

In the summer of 2023, wildfires devastated our communities in Central British Columbia, Alberta and the Northwest Territories. Despite the significant loss, our communities' resilience shone through. Teams from all areas of Western Financial Group rallied together to support each other and our customers as evacuation orders were issued for over 155,00 residents.

Despite the unfolding natural disaster, our teams went above and beyond the call of duty to support their neighbours, from volunteering their time to help with clean-up efforts to offering their homes as temporary shelters. Our teams demonstrated care for their communities by working tirelessly to provide efficient and compassionate insurance services to assist those affected by the fires.

Building Communities one grant at a time

These projects benefit the community's future by contributing to its strength and resilience, enhancing sustainability, accessibility, health and safety, and creating connections and a sense of belonging to allow our communities to flourish.

Grant Recipients Spotlight

Langley Child & Youth Advocacy Centre (CYAC) Langley, British Columbia

Today, one out of three children experience some form of abuse in British Columbia, only a small number of victims report their abuse, and even fewer receive the care and support they need to heal. The creation of a new Langley Child & Youth Advocacy Centre (CYAC) will offer collaborative services in response to child abuse and crimes against children and youth, as well as support for their non-offending caregivers, helping to fill a crucial gap in service in the community. The centre connects children, youth, and their families to tailored services, helping them navigate medical, criminal justice, and child protection systems —all within a safe space, under one roof. By assigning a dedicated professional to support families from disclosure to court outcomes, the Centre minimizes the need for re-telling stories and re-traumatization for victims.

École Salisbury Morse Place School Winnipeg, Manitoba

From the seeds of an idea sparked in 2019, the École Salisbury Morse Place School team embarked on a journey to transform their playground. The need was clear: their diverse student body, including those with disabilities, deserved a new play structure and green space where everyone could play together. The existing play structure, surrounded by unforgiving railway ties and pea gravel, posed barriers for wheelchair users and walkers alike.

They have developed a three-phased plan through thoughtful design. The first phase includes building a play area that ensures accessibility for everyone. This area will have a rubberized surface and equipment at ground level, allowing children and people of all abilities to play and move comfortably.

Community Support in Action

Our Gilbert Plains office raised nearly \$2,500 through annual events and fundraising activities for the local elementary school's "Parents as Partners in Literacy" project.

When the Dauphin Seniors bus crash occurred, our team in Gilbert Plains didn't hesitate to step up. They donated \$10,000 on behalf of Western Financial Group to the Dauphin and District Community Foundations' Support our Seniors fund, a direct and significant contribution to the recovery efforts. They also donated \$7,000 to support the Gilbert Plains Fire Department and other community projects, demonstrating their commitment to the community.

In Souris and Brandon, Manitoba, our teams embraced community support during the holidays by collecting and donating food to local projects, such as Bear Clan, the Women's Resource Centre, the Samaritan House, and more.

Embracing Giving and Volunteerism

In 2023, our Brandon, Manitoba team raised \$3,270 for the Blue Door Project to support children, youth, adults and families experiencing homelessness and donated \$4,800 to the United Way, with \$2,800 contributed from team members.

Our Winnipeg branches also collected 70 pounds of food donations for the Transcona Food Bank and over 1,000 pairs of socks for the Main Street Project. They were actively involved in various community projects and volunteer programs throughout the city, such as Habitat for Humanity, the Blue Door Project, the Ronald McDonald House Home for Dinner program, and Winnipeg Harvest.



National Walk to Support the Cause

Since 2005, Western Financial Group, through its Communities Foundation, has been organizing a 5km National Walk to raise funds for local communities from coast to coast. In 2023, over 1,600 team members in more than 150 Canadian communities sported their blue Western t-shirts, walking alongside local business and community partners, neighbours and friends to show their support and raise funds for charities that are meaningful to them. Thanks to the generosity of our team members and supporters, we donated over \$80,000! These funds have made a tangible impact, supporting more than 100 local causes across Canada, as selected by our team members.
