We are happy to report that five infrastructure grant projects were allotted to Indigenous communities, and a record 14 Inspirational Awards were granted to Indigenous students to help them pursue educational opportunities.

WESTERN INSPIRATIONAL AWARD

Karl Ericksson Selkirk Secondary School, Kimberley, BC

The Foundation celebrates our Future Leaders through the Western Inspirational Award. Awarded annually, this bursary is given to high school students who have displayed outstanding community and school spirit or have overcome adversity and/or hardships. These students inspire us and their communities, and this award recognizes their efforts and determination to meet life's challenges.

The following is a story about one of our 2022 Western Inspirational Award Recipients, Karl Erickson.

In the Spring of 2021, Karl attended a ski training camp. With the sun shining bright, Karl burned the retina and macula in both of his eyes due to the sun reflecting off the snow. This accident took 87% of his vision leaving him with a condition called Solar Retinopathy.

"Before the accident my dream and goal was to be a pilot. Being legally blind, I will never be able to get a driver's licence or become a pilot. When I graduated from High School this past June, I watched my friends and classmates go to college to start pursuing their dreams. I was feeling lost and not sure what I wanted to do or what my purpose would be. In November of 2022, I decided to join the Para Snow Sport program and immediately knew this is where I belong. I am around people who understand me and my disability and accept me as I am. Ski racing visually impaired is a major challenge but I love it. It gives me purpose and hope.

My goal is to make the Canadian Para-Alpine Ski Team and represent Canada at the 2026 Paralympics in Milano Cortina Italy. I am learning all that I can to adapt to my new disability and become a successful ski racer."

UKRAINE HUMANITARIAN APPEAL

Supporting New Arrivals with the Canadian Red Cross

The conflict in Ukraine continues to have widespread and devastating humanitarian impacts, and the Red Cross continues to work around the clock to respond to humanitarian needs in Ukraine and surrounding countries. In partnership with our Foundation, Western Financial Group was humbled to be in a position to provide much-needed support through a combined donation of \$100,000 to the Canadian Red Cross.

The Red Cross has collectively supported more than 5 million people impacted by the conflict in Ukraine and surrounding countries. The Red Cross has longstanding experience in welcoming new arrivals to Canada, having played an instrumental role in supporting Syrian refugees in 2016 and Haitian asylum seekers in 2017.

COMMUNITY FEATURE DOIG RIVER FIRST NATION CULTURAL SPACES PLAN

This year, the Western Financial Group Communities Foundation was proud to award \$5,000 Community Infrastructure Grants to 58 different projects, five of which were given to Indigenous and First Nations communities. One of these grants was given to Doig River First Nation, Tsáá? Ché Ne Dane, a proud Dane-zaa people indigenous to the upper Peace River region of British Columbia and Alberta.

Their traditional base extends in all directions from Gat Tah Kwâ, now called the city of Fort St. John. Today, their members participate in the modern economy while practising their unique language, culture and traditions.



We came to be known as the Fort St. John Beaver Band, acknowledging our place as first peoples of this region, after 1794, when colonizers arrived with the fur trade. In 1900, our headmen signed Treaty 8 to preserve our rights to hunt and trap and to work alongside newcomers in peace. It was only after the fur trade, and as recently as 1952, that we were forced to settle on reserves. In 1977, our ancestors (the Fort St. John Beaver Band) were divided and defined by the Department of Indian Affairs as two separate Nations, the Doig River First Nation and the Blueberry River First Nation. Today, DRFN's population is 335 people and our members live on and off reserve.

Our community is engaged in a range of economic initiatives focused on strengthening our economic base, while improving the health and wellness of our people. In 2020, we developed a Cultural Spaces plan, which includes 20 different on- and off-reserve cultural spaces throughout our territory. Establishing quality cultural buildings and gathering spaces supports the vision for our community and is identified as a priority in our Community Plan.

The cultural spaces in our plan are vital, connected part of our larger infrastructure needs and come from a longstanding history of engagement with our members.

Improvements to existing infrastructure spaces including the ball diamonds, and new church property are also identified in the plan. We anticipate adding better lighting, washrooms and a playground area at our ball diamonds.

ESTEVAN PUBLIC YOUTH CENTRE

Estevan, South Saskatchewan

Through the Western Financial Group Communities Foundation, Western's local Estevan branch donated \$2,209 to the Estevan Public Youth Centre (EPYC) to help create safe spaces for youth in this small community.

"It started with many months of due diligence and a strong community partner in United Way Estevan. We began by pulling together a team that had a passion to serve our community's youth. From there, we used other youth organizations within our province as mentors. We worked together to formulate our own vision, mission, and values. From the outset, we were scanning our community for a potential brick and mortar location.
